A cause for celebration

- MHPHDS Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) team completed a mammoth regional fit testing operation, travelling from the Southwest to the Goldfields and north to Broome. The IPC team has fit-tested more than 65 health staff in regional WA and more than 800 Dental Health Services (DHS) staff.
- NMHS has introduced a culturally secure, mobile service dedicated to Aboriginal in-home COVID vaccination. It has been well-received and supported by other aboriginal organisations and take-up has been steadily rising.
- The SCGH High Risk Foot Service, achieved accreditation by the National Association of Diabetes Centres as a centre of Excellence, only the second high-risk foot service in WA to be accredited at this level, and one of only 8 accredited nationally.
