Reflections on consumer and staff feedback are a monthly focus for the Board, in addition to reflecting on NMHS's values. The stories offer valuable insights to help us understand the needs of consumers and their concerns to improve services and deliver excellent health care. The Board considered the role of empathy and respect when communicating with consumers to make interactions and experiences more positive. The Board noted an on-going issue of defensiveness and failure to acknowledge a failure in many responses.

Presentations to the Board

The Board was delighted to welcome the Acting Director General of Health who provided an update on the new Women's and Babies' Hospital following the announcement it would be constructed on the Murdoch site, co-located with Fiona Stanley. Implications for the services on the Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre site, expansion plans for OPH and investment at SCGH were also discussed

The Board also heard from the A/Executive Director Safety, Quality, Governance and Consumer Engagement about the NMHS Consumer Engagement and Partnership Model. The Model outlined a new approach to partnering with consumers to shape the way health services are designed and delivered, and was supported by resources to and enhance community representation.

Audit and Risk Committee

No meeting held in April.

Finance Committee

The Committee received a presentation from WNHS about performance and activity, and an update on Stage 2 of the Joondalup Health Campus redevelopment

In addition, discussions focussed on performance, activity and staffing trends, including strategies to ensure financial sustainability.

People, Engagement and Culture Committee

The Committee welcomed an update on progress of the SCGOPHCG Junior Medical Officer Manifesto, which is focussed on improving culture and working conditions for junior doctors.

Health and Social Care Strategy, Aboriginal Employment and Wellbeing, integrity and workforce reports were also considered.

Safety, Quality and Consumer Engagement Committee

The Committee received a presentation from WNHS Maternal Fetal Medicine, a State-wide service that manages high-risk obstetrics and congenital anomalies, and received an update on preparations for accreditation at SCGOPHCG.

The monthly consumer, clinical incidents and safety and quality performance reports were considered, with focus on elective surgery and outpatient performance.
